

Synopsis:

The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time takes place in the year 2023 in and around the town of Swindon, England. The fifteen-year-old narrator of the story, Christopher John Francis Boone, and the titular curious incident is the mystery surrounding the death of Wellington, his neighbor Mrs. Shears' poodle, after Christopher finds the dog speared with a garden fork. While trying to discover who killed Wellington, he encounters resistance from many neighbors, but mostly from his widowed father, Ed.

Act 1: Scenes take place in Swindon, England, UK

Mrs. Shears Garden; a Police Station; Christopher's Home; Christopher's School; the School Office; Christopher's Street; a Park; the Beach; A Map of the House; Back to Reality; Night.

Intermission

Act 2: Scenes take place in Train Stations, Swindon and London, England, UK

The School Room and School Hall; Christopher's Street; Christopher's Home; Swindon; Swindon Train Station; On A Train; a Dream; Back to Reality; a Platform; a Tube Train; Willesden Junction; Outside Judy's House; Inside Judy's House; in Christopher's Bedroom at Judy's; the Middle of the Night, the Corridor Outside Christopher's Room; Judy's Kitchen; London Street at Night; Hampstead Heath; Judy's Home; Christopher's Home; Christopher's Street; Christopher's School; an Exam Room.

Director's Note:

As a director, this has been one of the most challenging pieces that I've ever worked on. From a script that doesn't provide much guidance to working with characters, I don't encounter in my day-to-day life. I also wanted to present this story like no other locally had done. This stripped-down production required me and my set designer to create a space that represented all the various backdrops that we needed to create. The lights will help enhance the backdrop and help keep the journey lit. The sound I struggled with the most. While the script leaves a lot of room for creativity, I felt that it also helps you relate the most to Christopher.

Christopher is a character that doesn't share a lot when it comes to his emotions. I introduced the ensemble to help share those emotions he cannot produce. Siobhan's character is also used to help you understand all that is going on in his head. This is Christopher's story. A journey he started by trying to solve a mystery, he ultimately proves he's a brave young man that can do anything he wants, regardless of limitations set by society. I hope this journey leaves you the way it leaves Christopher - knowing you can do anything you want.
